**The aim** of the Centre is to promote international understanding among young people of the world, encouraging racial harmony and an awareness of the needs of others.

**A full** and varied programme has been designed to promote cultural awareness which will include sightseeing tours, entertainment, team building, and the opportunity to share ideas with other participants and hosts.



**Visitors** to the Youth Centre must be sponsored by a Lions Club in their own country, and that club will be responsible for arranging travel, insurance, and ensuring that the participants have adequate spending money for the duration of their stay, including their period of stay with a host family.

## The City of Liverpool

Liverpool, the very name conjures up images of a glorious maritime history, world-beating musical heritage, and two of the Premiership's biggest football teams and not one, but two majestically different Cathedrals. It is now bulging with fabulous new shops, as well as a world class cultural offering with more museums and galleries anywhere outside of London.

The Beatles, and Liverpool and Everton football clubs, attract many visitors. The two cathedrals one Anglican the other Roman Catholic were both completed after the Second World War when bomb damage was restored.

In the 1980s the Albert Dock shopping centre and museums, including the Maritime Museum and the Tate Art Gallery attracted many tourists, and in 2008 the celebrations relating to the European Capital of Culture ensured that Liverpool enjoyed a massive face lift,
